Comcast Business Ethernet will help NASCAR Productions enhance communications between NASCAR officials and teams while they are operating within the infield and help broadcast partners send files from the media compound at each track. Comcast Business will work with APXnet and ARRIS to deliver Internet connectivity to and from end user devices at each of the five tracks.

In September 2014, Comcast and NASCAR <u>announced</u> an agreement to make XFINITY the third title sponsor in the storied 30+ year history of the series, and the Official Entertainment Provider of NASCAR starting in 2015.
